Amy Farrell is the Vice President of Market Development at America's Natural Gas Alliance (ANGA). Ms. Farrell leads ANGA's efforts to increase natural gas demand in the transportation, power generation, industrial, and export sectors. She is responsible for developing and executing ANGA's market development strategy through advocacy efforts across the market spectrum, including direct outreach to critical end users, coalition building with strategic partners along the value chain, and targeted education and relationship building with key decision makers. Before joining the private sector, Ms. Farrell spent nearly a decade in the government, most recently serving in the George W. Bush White House National Economic Council as a Special Assistant to the President for Economic Policy handling energy policy. She also served as an Associate Director for Environment and Regulation in the White House Council on Environmental Quality. Prior to moving to the White House, Ms. Farrell served in two different positions at the Environmental Protection Agency. She was the Deputy Assistant Administrator for the Office of Prevention, Pesticides and Toxic Substances (now the Office of Chemical Safety and Pollution Prevention) and a Policy Advisor to Administrators Stephen Johnson and Michael Leavitt. Ms. Farrell began her government career as a policy analyst in the Office of Management and Budget's Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs, where she reviewed environmental and energy regulations. Ms. Farrell has a Master's degree in Public Policy from Indiana University's School of Public and Environmental Affairs and a Bachelor's degree in Biology from Illinois Wesleyan University.
